Greetings Church!

It's time for a pastoral moment of honesty: I don't really like devotionals. Well, let me rephrase that: Though I have found many devotionals to be well written, faith building, and thought provoking, I have never completed a devotional according to the schedule for which it was designed. Most of them, though, I don't finish at all. I am certain some of the problem here is my attention span and ever-changing schedule which bars me from completion, but mostly that I haven't found one that fully embraces the energy and motivation to change the world I receive from the Scriptures.

Why do devotionals all feel like you should be in your robe, at dawn, watching the sunrise, pondering the book's offering of wisdom while both hands grip a steaming cup of your favorite hot beverage? Don't get me wrong, I do have a deep appreciation for them; they possess great tidbits of scriptural wisdom and insight. The problem I have is that they also seem to have this effect on us, calling us to remain in that position, rather than to go out and put that new thing into action.

For instance, it is very good for us to know that in faith we receive the armor of God...

"¹³ Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breast-plate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." (Ephesians 6:13-17)

It is truly a blessing to know in your heart that you have been graciously given these great gifts. But, now reimagine yourself in the first, devotional scenario, except instead of your house robe and slippers, you're wearing the full armor of God! It seems a bit ridiculous, doesn't it?! These great implements of protection weren't designed for our cuddly back porch moments, they were designed for battle; to protect you from harm while you protect others from harm! We've been given all the tools we need to go out into the world, seeking justice and freeing the oppressed, and yet we receive it in the comforts of home as a side dish to our brunch.

Perhaps it's not the devotional at all in which I have found my frustrations, but the mode of delivery and consumption, and the consumer's lack of response.

Why are there people suffering in this country while 65% of our adults claim to be Christian, and therefore possess this very same armor? Has the devotional model played a part in creating a larger model of inaction?

What should we be doing with all this armor? To what works should we really be devoted?

JUNE LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Financial Report: The budget finished in the black this month and donations have increased somewhat. Cleaning service has been reduced from 2 times per week to once a week, cutting that expense by half. The parsonage mortgage will be paid from the Mortgage and Missions fund rather than the Ministry fund.

Outreach/Missions: Rene DeYoung has assumed the position of Event Coordinator. A Kid's Corner, Sunday School activities, and Monday afternoon summer play dates are a few of the events she has organized and helped to launch so far. She was instrumental in coordinating the Memorial Day Parade participation representing Hope UMC, as well as the recent community picnic. The LT voted to endorse support for Michiana Family Center as a new mission field, in addition to the continuing support of the Edwardsburg Food Pantry.

Pastor's Report: The Sunday morning messages for the next few weeks will address Stewardship. The next Time To Talk meeting is scheduled for June 26, 2022, at 2:00 p.m. to further explain The Ministry Fund and Mortgage and Missions Fund, as well as present the vision for the church. Mike Morgan represented Hope UMC at the 2022 Annual Conference and will share his experience and takeaway with the congregation at an upcoming Sunday morning service. Livestreaming and You Tube will now focus on the Modern Service and determine response and views.

Trustee's Report: It was agreed to accept the bid from Duck Heating and Cooling regarding new furnace installation. Discussion took place regarding roof replacement for Reese Hall. The manufacturer will be contacted with respect to the condition of the shingles.


