James and his wife, Aisling, founded and operate the Michiana Family Center, a local organization that "collaborates with our community to provide support for our families, especially those experiencing Foster Care. MFC supports families by offering Mentors to middle and high school students, Support Groups for parents, and Care Teams for the entire family. Did you know? There are over 1,300 children in Foster Care in Michiana. Statistically, over half of these young people will not graduate from high school and only 3% of them will go on to graduate from college. Simply put, Foster families are struggling today due to a lack of support. MAY LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Financial Report: As giving remains somewhat diminished over previous years, the LT discussed methods of paring expenses and suggested contributors consider redirecting a portion of their offering to ministry funds from which basic expenses are covered. The LT unanimously agreed to move the mortgage payment to the Mortgage and Missions Fund, and to suspend making the extra principal payments commencing with the next payment due. Other cost-cutting measures were discussed.

Outreach/Missions: Several persons attended the May 1 Inclusivity/ Separation discussion group, and expressed interest in continuing the talks moving forward. Discussion ensued regarding the need for more familyoriented activities including a game and movie night which may be attractive to younger families. Brandon DeYoung expounded on his proposal for a Children's Corner in 2nd service utilizing furnishings already available from classrooms. It has already been successfully incorporated into the Modern Service in Reese Hall.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Nate introduced a proposed staff position for a Children, Youth Ministry and Event Coordinator. He indicated that the position has existed previously, and would be beneficial in planning, organizing, and coordinating the structure for Sunday worship, Sunday School and community-oriented events.

Trustee's Report: Mike Morgan received quotes from two of the three Heating and Cooling Companies regarding the furnaces in both buildings. In the interest of supporting local businesses, it was suggested that he contact Sam's Heating and Cooling in Edwardsburg, for an additional comparison quote.
