



AUGUST LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

FINANCIAL REPORT: Although a few people have shifted their giving from missions to ministry, income remains somewhat below expenses. New Live streaming equipment was purchased from the computer upgrade fund, while parsonage furnace and A/C was purchased from Capital Improvements Fund. An additional \$8,100.00 from Capital Improvements Fund will cover replacement of Reese Hall furnaces in September.

GENERAL REPORT: An educational/informational meeting was held on August 14 to discuss youth programming ideas to include middle and high schoolers. The Youth Group would be scheduled for the 2nd Sunday of each month, and will include both Bible Study type activities and community service projects. Messy Church will continue on the 4th Sunday of each month and is open to all ages.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Regarding upcoming Inclusivity Vote in the fall, Pastor Nate has indicated that until the General Conference decision is made, our local voting outcome should not be strictly enforced, but regarded as a non-binding statement of the chosen direction. He encourages members to vote passionately with their true feelings and opinions. Two additional Mobile Food Pantry stops are scheduled for September and October in Hope's Parking Lot, and help with unloading and distribution would be welcomed and appreciated.

TRUSTEES' REPORT: Quotes were provided from two sources for replacement of Reese Hall Roof. One of the Contractors is pursuing the manufacturer of the shingles regarding possible warranty reimbursement because of the extreme wear the shingles are exhibiting. Both of the roofing companies will be contacted regarding quotes for replacing only one-half of the roof.


These answered prayers are in line with God's will. We trust that these answers are for our good. Even though in our human form we think differently. It may be hard to accept or easily received in love.

<u>OUR HELP — PAST, PRESENT, FUTURE</u>

This month, America marks the anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, which ended almost 3,000 lives and changed life forever for millions more. The nation was shaken to its very roots, with violence jolting out of us any assumption that "it can't happen here." September 11 banished any lingering notion that being on the side of "liberty and justice for all" served as insulation against mass tragedy. We now had more to fear than fear itself.

Psalm 46 reminds us that "though the earth should change" (v. 2) — as it did on 9/11 —God remains "our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (v. 1). We are never alone or without hope, even on life-altering days.
