Dear friends, the time is upon us: The Vote!

Some of us have been dreading it, some deeply desiring it, some upset we didn't do it sooner, some wishing we wouldn't do it at all. This month, Hope United Methodist Church will hold a membership-wide polling on our desired direction relative to human sex and sexuality. Individual members will have the opportunity to select either a Traditional Path or an Inclusive Path, that we as a church might better understand who we are and where we are going.

Our congregation represents a diverse spectrum of theological understandings and practices, and just like the vote itself, some hold firm Traditional beliefs, some bold Inclusive beliefs, most land somewhere in the middle with slight leanings one way or another, and many wish we just wouldn't talk about it at all. Let us first, before any other discussion or steps forward, hold tightly to the fact that we have been drawn together as one body in Christ, for reasons beyond our theological leanings, but because of our faith in Christ Jesus alone. And may that knowledge of God calling us one, despite our differences, give us the courage to move forward in grace.

Beyond all the turmoil surrounding the greater United Methodist Church, we at Hope UMC are creating time and space for this vote to take place for two basic and powerful reasons: to know who we are, and to know where we are going.

First, it is essential to our faith and future to know who we are and the diversity that exists within our fellowship. Many at Hope have a few people with whom they are deeply connected, several people they know and love but aren't quite so deeply connected, and even more people with whom they simply exchange Sunday morning pleasantries. While we likely know the stances of our closest friends, it is impossible for us to truly know the hearts of every smiling face in this place. While the vote won't fully disclose every individual theology in the church, it will give us a solid grasp of the leanings and diversity within our church body. It is essential to faith for us to realize that we represent a spectrum of understanding, to know about what the ratio of those understandings are within this body, and to realize that that ratio is different within every church, worldwide... but it is always a ratio... always a spectrum. It gives us identity. It allows individuals within the church to know there are others, on either side of their stance, making up this community of faith. It allows us to properly express, to newcomers and to the community, where we stand and where we are going. And, when we identify as diverse in understanding, we gain grace for accepting other churches with different ratios along the same spectrum. (Continued on next page)

Second, it is essential to our faith and future that we claim that identity as our path forward. As individuals, when the church claims its identity and path, one may then decide if that identity fits their personal theology and if it fits who they are and where they wish to go, rather than just sitting, wondering, and receiving no solid answers. As a church, it gives us not just a path forward but a gauge to determine the speed at which we ought to move in that direction. If the results reveal us to be 90% to 10%, in either direction, it becomes clear to us that we can take swift, grace-filled steps in that direction. If the results are 55%/45%, in either direction, we must claim that diverse identity and slowly proceed with grace. And if the results 70%/30%, in either direction, we know to take intentional, graceful steps in a definite direction at an intentional, graceful pace.

If you are a member of Hope United Methodist Church, you are invited to vote in this matter. Your vote matters, and we hope you will take this opportunity to prayerfully cast your ballot. Voting will take place at the following times:

Sunday, October 2nd, 8am to Noon Wednesday, October 5th, 6pm to 8pm Sunday, October 9th, 8am to Noon

Please choose the statement that best represents your vision for the future of Hope United Methodist Church.

Hope United Methodist Church should maintain the <u>Traditional View</u> of scripture and our theology should indicate that homosexuality is inconsistent with Christian teaching. As such, Hope United Methodist Church will not accept practicing homosexual clergy or allow the performance of homosexual marriage.

Hope United Methodist Church should adopt the <u>Inclusive View</u> of scripture and our theology should indicate that all are welcome to participate in all aspects of faith. As such, Hope United Methodist Church will accept LGBTQ+ clergy and will allow LGBTQ+ marriage within the church.

SEPTEMBER LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Financial Report: Church finances have improved over the past couple of months and expenses are being met. The LT discussed ideas for additional funding for Capital Improvements including the potential redirecting of designated funds, such as the Steeple Fund and the Memorial Fund. It was noted that application has been made for an unclaimed fund in the amount of \$7,000.00.

Trustee Report: The LT voted unanimously to replace the entire roof over Reese Hall. After reviewing the submitted proposals, the LT has determined that Mike Neely has offered the best price and lifetime guarantee of the shingles, and will contract with him for the installation of the new roof.

General Report: The Annual Charge Conference has been scheduled for November 2, 2022, at 7:30 p.m. Although the conference will take place via Zoom, the congregation is invited to attend and participate. Details will follow regarding the location (Sanctuary or Reese Hall) in which the Charge Conference will take place.

Verification of Membership commenced on September 18th and another opportunity for member verification will be offered on Sunday, September 24 This is to ensure that members only will be voting regarding Inclusivity on October 2 and October 9. An additional voting opportunity will be offered on Wednesday, October 5, 2022, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the church.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Nate indicated that he has reached out to several homebound members and persons who are now residing in care facilities, by phone call or personal visitation in order to better engage and connect with their specific needs. The LT will be looking to replace four (4) team members commencing January 2023, as four current members will be completing their terms at the end of 2022. Please advise Pastor Nate or Jim Weingart if you are interested in serving on the Leadership Team.


