Beyond all circumstance, beyond all desire, and beyond all these emotions, peace reigns in my heart. JANUARY LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

FINANCIAL REPORT: The LT reviewed and approved the proposed 2023 Budget provided by Dawn. Pastor Nate indicated that the Hope Emergency Fund had received donations from Christmas giving prior to Christmas despite the inclement weather affecting attendance on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. In addition, \$500.00 was transferred from the Mission Fund into the Hope Emergency Fund.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS: Nominations were accepted and approved as follows: Brandon DeYoung will serve as Chairperson, with Jack Rinehart serving as Vice Chairperson. Sandie Weiler will continue serving as Secretary and Sabrina English as Finance Representative.

GENERAL REPORT: Members of the LT expressed their visions for the coming year which include increased community outreach, how to better care for our members and congregation, and how to secure more volunteerism. In addition, it was voted to contain LT Meetings to no more than 1-1/2 hours in length, and to add unresolved issues to the Agenda for the following month's meeting. Additional members are needed to round out the SPRC and it was determined that SPRC should meet at least on a quarterly basis.

The LT is still seeking 2-3 additional members. Please consider serving on this team as an opportunity to provide your suggestions, visions, and hope for growth for your church and the community.

Going out of our way

In mid-2022, Mediterranean Shipping Company, a world leader in container transport, voluntarily changed its routes, on the advice of scientists, to protect large populations of blue whales off the Sri Lankan coast. Going out of its way 15 nautical miles has led to a whopping 95% drop in whale strikes.

Jesus counseled people to go out of their way for one another, especially for the vulnerable: "If anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles." Further, "whoever gives one of these little ones even a cup of cold water ... will by no means lose his reward" (Matthew 5:40-41; 10:42, ESV).

Paul likewise urged his listeners to voluntarily give up eating meat, even if they didn't believe in and weren't challenged by the idols to which it had been sacrificed, for the sake of new believers with weaker faith (Romans 14).

Faith calls us to go out of our way for the sake of others; sometimes a wealthy corporation opts to do the same. God's hand is at work in both, protecting vulnerable humans and nonhumans alike.




Edwardsburg Museum Thank You

We truly appreciate this very precious gift, and it should be ready to be on display when we open next Spring. Please come to see it."








As I am 79 years old I look back on my life and reflect all

the times of trouble and joy I've had. I accepted Christ

into my heart and life at age 47 on April 3 at 1:00pm in my Boss's (President;s) office shar-

ing the message with a vendor of ours who had called me many times to ask the question if I were a Christian. I'm thankful he was persistent and shared Christ that April day.

When I look back at the times I struggled, I see that Jesus helped me through even though I didn't think so at the time. Still in my human heart I want Heaven here on this earth but reality, which the Bible tells us, Heaven is where we will be when this earthly life is over.

I have learned to use my experiences, both good and bad, to help others either find Jesus or to strengthen their faith. Jesus tells us to witness to help others and to rely on Him to carry us along in this earthly life.

In your human heart may you find someone, or rely on Jesus to share your good times and the bad times and may your reward be the gift of Heaven. See you there.
