
As always, I encourage you to start your day with a devotional like the Upper Room. It only takes a few minutes and will help to focus you on our Savior Jesus.



JULY LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

FINANCE: Reviewing financial information provided by Dawn, finances remain stable with receipts slightly above expenses for the past month. Camp Scholarships were distributed in the sum of \$200.00 per camper, with five (5) youth attending UM Camps this summer.

TRUSTEE REPORT: The Parsonage Lease Agreement was completed and executed between Hope UMC and New Journey Church of Niles Michigan, and the tenant, the new Pastor serving New Journey Church, will reside in the home for the next year. The trustees will serve as property managers during the one-year lease. Discussion followed regarding additional parking lot repair, and looking into attaining estimates for restroom door activation switches in Reese Hall.

SPRC: Brandon DeYoung offered to assume responsibility for updating the Shirley Andrews Award for Musical Excellence.

PASTOR'S REPORT: A quick overview of the current governance model of the church was presented by Pastor Rob and reviewed with LT. Discussion regarding the transition of pastors offered positive feedback from LT members.
