
Annual CROP Walk Combats Hunger & Disasters

The headlines lately have been disturbing: "Global food prices rising amid mass shortages," was in the August issue of the local paper. According to Church World Service ("CWS"), a nonprofit Christian organization, 828 million people—about 1 in 10—experienced hunger in 2022. CROP Hunger Walk Every year walkers are sponsored to raise funds in the CWS CROP Walk.

This year's event is being held at the Cassopolis COA track on **Sunday**, **October 1,** registration 1:30, walk at 2:00PM. CWS has programs to:

- *Combat hunger by helping small farmers with ways to improve harvests and adapt to climate change, such as a bee program in Africa and gardens and greenhouses in Guatemala,
- *Protect children, including health, food, and safe school zones,
- *Provide clean water, hygiene, and sanitation,
- *Support communities after natural disasters, delivering kits and blankets to help people,
- *Support refugees, which began after World War II and continues now in 23 refugee offices across the U.S., including Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo, and South Bend, and also supporting Ukrainian refugees in Eastern Europe.
- *Support for the 120,000 unaccompanied minors who arrive at the U.S. each year, where sponsor homes are inspected and supported to avoid human trafficking.

You can help others by seeking sponsors and coming out for the CROP Walk. You will be helping your neighbors because 25% of the proceeds go to five food banks in Cass County. "Because of high food prices, Helping Hands' food pantry has served almost double the number of people this year," said board member Leigh Goyings, "and I hear the same from other area pantries." Event planners have picked a "worker bee" theme so wear your yellow and black and walk to "bee" part of the solution. For further information, go to cwsglobal.org or call Leigh at 269-591-1334.

LT Highlights are brief for this month due to an abbreviated LT Meeting.




Own a piece of Edwardsburg UMC History
