#### Greetings people of Hope!



#### OCTOBER LT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



**FINANCES:** The LT reviewed financial information provided by Dawn and noted another month in the black. After discussion regarding division of the Christmas Eve offering, it was voted unanimously to divide the special offering between Michiana Family Center and UMCOR. In addition, it was voted to direct mission funds in the sum of \$600.00, to Michiana Family Center to assist with specific needs which the organization has presented. Discussion took place regarding computer upgrades after reviewing proposals presented by Brandon for office computers.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Rob inquired if an evening Christmas Eve service should be scheduled as Christmas Eve falls on Sunday, or if only the two morning services should be offered. After minimal discussion, it was decided to offer one morning service at 10:00 a.m. on December 24, with an evening Christmas Eve service at 6:00 p.m. Discussion ensued regarding improvements to current technical equipment for music ministry and Pastor Rob suggested possibly including a budget line for technology upgrades in 2024.

Hope's annual charge conference will take place on Sunday, December 10, 2023, with the time to be announced.




#### A Buzzy CROP Walk

It was a beautiful afternoon on October 1 when 71 walkers from over 10 churches assembled at the Council on Aging track. They came with a purpose: to share God's love with those struggling near and far. The total pledges for the 2023 CROP Walk reached almost \$13,000. Funds will be used by Church World Service to provide food, clean water, and many more programs to those whose homes and livelihoods have been wiped out by war, natural disasters, and climate change. Locally 25% of the funds will be shared by five food pantries in Cass County. Hope's team of 10 walkers and one puppy raised \$1,623. The colorful yellow and black striped walkers (in recognition of a new CWS beekeeping program) know they can "bee" a beacon on light to those in need.


#### Parsonage Mortgage Update:
