**FINANCES:** Finances are good again for December; funds received exceeded expenses for the month of December by \$26,667.64. The year's receipts exceeded expenses by \$27,791.11. 2023 receipts were 7% more than the amount budgeted. This was the first time this has happened since Dawn has been doing finances.

**PRAYER CHAPEL:** Jack Weiler presented plans for a prayer chapel. The Chapel would be placed between the two buildings. The project is currently priced out between \$4,900-6,000 but could change due to prices going up since last fall when plans were first started. There are also a couple grants that we may qualify for that could be used for this project to make it nicer if we would like. Jack has been authorized for up to \$8,000 for materials for the chapel.

**FIRST RESPONDERS TEAM:** Discussion was held to get members of the certified or recertified in first aid, CPR and AED usage.



Current Parsonage Mortgage Balance = \$117,021 after the January 2024 Payment.


Our projected payoff date is May 2036, which is 4 years earlier than the original payoff date!



**CROSS OF ASHES** — On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return."

## A LITTLE COMMUNITY SANCTUARY

#### "Be Joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Wanda Orth has long envisioned a prayer chapel; a place of solace and prayer, open and available 24/7. Jack Weiler envisioned incorporating the remaining stained-glass windows from the old uptown church into a little chapel. Jack began to develop the idea in his head, and soon transferred his vision to the drawing board. Learning of Wanda's passion and enthusiasm for an accessible prayer chapel and her previously established funding for such a project, their respective visions began to take shape.

Plans are for the chapel to be located in the open space between the two current buildings. The structure will integrate four to seven stained glass windows, will be approximately 12 feet long and 10 feet wide, with a 5x8 front porch entry, and a six-foot steeple.

The goal is to commence the project in early April (weather permitting) with a projected finish of four to six weeks. This will only become a reality with volunteers willing to commit their time and skills to help follow this vision to completion.


